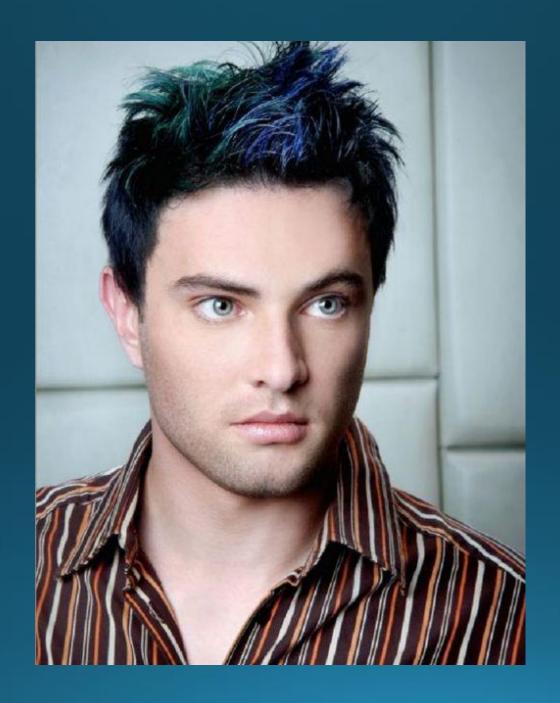

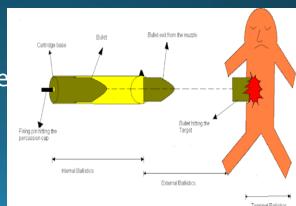
 It is the application of the study of bones (osteology) to the field of forensic medicine

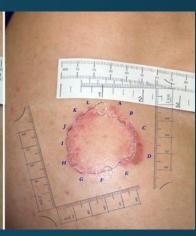

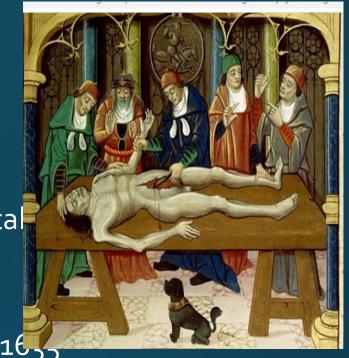

Inquest

Police inquest

- Sec. 174 CrPC
- Police to inquire on suicide, etc.
- Procedure
 - Intimation to the nearest Magistrate
 - Proceeds to the place of occurrence
 - Prepare inquest report
 - In suspicious cases

Magistrate Inquest

- Magistrate inquest is held under section 176 CrPC.
- Done in death in prison
- Purpose
 - Unjustly deprivation
 - person who is already buried

Inquest

Coroner's Inquest

- Officer of the rank of First Class Magistrate
- Coroner may be a doctor
- Inquire all unnatural deaths
- Power to order for exhumation
- Court of inquiry
