Medical negligence

- Negligence:
 - Act of omission
 - Act of commission

- Professional negligence:
 - Absence of reasonable care
 - Legal duty of a doctor
 - Fix standards of medical care
 - What constitutes injury
 - Damage & damages



- In action for negligence the plaintiff have to proof:
 - The doctor owed the duty
 - **Dereliction**/Breech of duty
 - Damage occurred
 - Cause of damage / Direct causation

- Types of negligence
 - Civil
 - Criminal
- Civil Negligence
 - When a patient brings suit in a civil court
 - When doctor brings a civil suit

- Civil negligence involves:
 - Act on the part of the treating physician
 - Compensable damage
 - CrPC and PPC
 - No legal punishment



- Criminal Negligence
 - More serious
 - Patient's death occurs
 - Associated with drunkenness
 - Incompetency and inattention
 - Criminal indifference



- Section 337-H PPC: Punishment for hurt by rash or negligent act:
- Burden of Proof
 - Bear by the patient
 - Preponderance of evidence
 - In civil cases
 - In criminal cases

- Examples of medical negligence
 - General Errors
 - Medicine
 - Surgery
 - Orthopedics and Emergency Medicine
 - Obstetrics and Gynecology
 - Anesthesiology
- Civil and criminal negligence by a single act



- Preventing Medical Litigation
 - Awareness of potential areas of litigation and medicolegal problems
 - Good 'doctor-patient' relationship
 - Appropriate training and maintenance of authorized protocol
 - Maintaining standard medical service
 - Proper counseling and informed consent

- Preventing Medical Litigation
 - Proper investigation
 - Adequate supervision and timely referral
 - Surgical intervention
 - Meticulous record keeping
 - Morbidity and mortality audits
 - Medical indemnity insurance
 - Medical defense

- Precautions against negligence:
 - Latest advances
 - Proper diagnosis
 - X-rays
 - Specialist consultation
 - Antibiotic cover
 - Consent
 - No procedure beyond skill
 - Instruments

- Doctrine of Res ipsa loquitur
 - 'The thing or fact speaks for itself'
 - Conditions
 - In the absence of negligence, the injury would not have occurred
 - Control over the injury producing instrument
 - No contributory negligence.
 - Examples
 - Injury, surgery, transfusion



Medical Maloccurrence

- Novus Actus Interveniens
 - Unrelated intervening action
 - Element of negligence is essential
 - Examples

- Contributory Negligence
 - Unreasonable conduct of patient
 - Concurrent negligence by the patient & doctor
 - Examples

 - Definition

 - Therapeutic:
 - Thyroid cancer, breast cancer
 - Diagnostic
 - Experimental
