

# Career in Ophthalmology Treatment outcome & Cost effectiveness

Most common causes of visual impairment and blindness are treatable or at least preventable

**Treatable: Refractive errors & Cataract** 

Preventable: Glaucoma, Diabetic retinopathy,

ARMD, Corneal Opacities, Ocular trauma

# Career in Ophthalmology Treatment outcome & Cost effectiveness

#### International Agency Prevention of Blindness Report (2013):

■ If blind population is rehabilitated, the productivity gain will be 0.7% of GDP

■ If only avoidable blindness is treated, savings will be 0.6% of GDP

Every dollar spent on prevention/treatment has potential of six dollars yield in return

New Stresses: Unavailability of Jobs/ future income/cost of training/new working atmosphere




# Ophthalmology
