

What Is Mind Map






Mind map

- It is a graphical way to represent ideas and concepts.
- It is a visual thinking tool that helps structuring information,
- Helping you to better analyze,
- comprehend, synthesize, recall and generate new ideas.




TOPIC SELECTION

Choosing your topic is the first step in the research process. Be aware that selecting a good topic may not be easy.



#1 Research tip: Pick a topic that interests you. You are going to live with this topic for weeks while you research, read, and write your assignment.



It must be narrow and focused enough to be interesting, yet broad enough to find adequate information.



Brainstorming is a technique you can use to help you generate ideas.





Write down any key words or concepts that may be of interest to you. Could these terms help be used to form a more focused research topic?






Characteristics of a good research question "FINER Criteria".

FEASIBLE	Adequate number of subjects.
	Adequate technical expertise
	Affordable in time and money
	Manageable in scope
INTERESTING	To the investigator
NOVEL	Confirms or refuses previous findings
	Extends previous findings
	Provides new findings
ETHICAL	
RELEVANT	To scientific knowledge
	To clinical and health policy
	To future research directions






P: female with family history/ female with no Hx
